After the fall/winter concert, the Pre-school and Kindergarten visited Piedmont Christian Home and our elementary students took their program on the road visiting Westchester Village. Both students and residents benefited greatly from the visit. The high school chorus performed at Westwood Nursing Home, and once again both the students and residents were blessed by the visit. Several of the students mentioned how much they enjoyed the interaction. Our current eighth grade, last year, chose a child from Vietnam their same age to support as a class through World Vision. What wonderful opportunities for our students to minister!

In the aftermath of the Haiti earthquake, our students wanted to get involved. Mr. Loggins came by with an idea to collect funds. Several people sprung into action connecting with World Hope International and worked through the logistics. The student council and Beta club took to the street and began collecting money using their hand made posters and buckets. It was an incredible experience for them to see the generosity of local residents. As the amount grew to over \$800, so did the excitement to participate in the other classes. During our chapel services that week we took up special offerings and Ms. Karam’s 4<sup>th</sup> grade class donated their jog-a-thon reward to the fund as well. Because of the diligence, generosity and caring of our students the total amount collected exceeds \$2,000. It is so encouraging to see the students working so intently to help others in need applying actions to become “World Changers.”

Chapel services have been great experiences. Our students leading music continue to grow, and do a great service preparing us for worship. We have had many wonderful messages. As a reminder, chapel is on Wednesday. Please ask your students about chapel and engage them in conversation about the message. 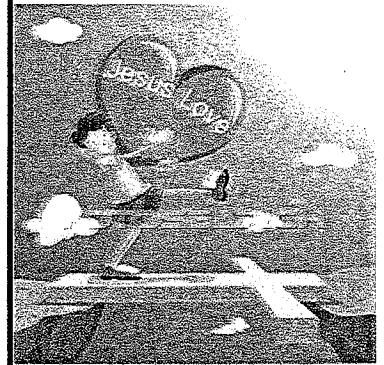
Why Hayworth? Because at Hayworth you find ordinary people serving and investing in the lives of your children in an extraordinary way challenging them to deliberately serve Christ.

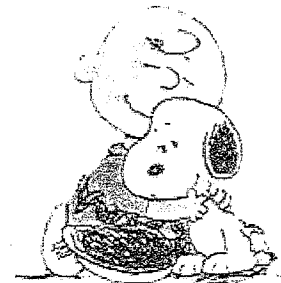
